Community Impact

The efforts of the women of the Junior League of Wilmington have had a lasting impact on our community. Many of our initiatives and programs have continued, with remarkable success, as independent agencies and organizations today. We look forward to continuing that impact and building a member-centric League.

Throughout the year, League members are engaging in advocacy, instructional outreach and hands-on charitable activities. The Junior League of Wilmington is focused on improving the lives of girls age 12-18 in Greater Wilmington. By working to empower young girls, we can positively influence their lives and their family unit.

The League will be making improvements to facilities at the Delaware Adolescent Program. The Delaware Adolescent Program, Inc. (DAPI) was founded in 1969 in New Castle County in order to afford pregnant teenagers a means by which to continue their education and receive pre-natal care. The Delaware Adolescent Program, Inc. is the only statewide comprehensive school based program serving pregnant and parenting teens and their families. DAPI serves the community with the following programs: Academic Instruction, Social Services, Child Care, on-site therapeutic counseling and Health Services.

The League will be conducting life skill workshops at Bayard House which is the only fully licensed residential program serving homeless or transitional pregnant minors in Delaware. The House serves homeless, pregnant teens and young women and their families, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, helping them become nurturing parents and independent, contributing members of society.

We are also developing a mentoring program, named The Sisterhood Project, for granddaughters of the families served by the Wilmington Senior Center. The Wilmington Senior Center was founded by the Junior League of Delaware. Located in the city's historic Brandywine Village, the Center is the premiere local resource for people 50+, their families and communities. The Center helps support a balanced and independent lifestyle by offering programs to stretch the mind, energize the body and lift the spirits. Life lived to the fullest. That's the goal of the Wilmington Senior Center.

Shortly after the 2016-17 League Year began, Erin's Law passed, and Delaware became the 28th state to adopt this important legislation, which required publicly funded schools to implement age-appropriate, prevention-oriented sexual abuse education. On August 10, Governor Jack Markell joined League members, Senator Henry, and leaders from our partners that supported the bill, including Prevent Child Abuse Delaware and the Beau Biden Foundation, at Junior League of Wilmington headquarters to sign the bill into law.



Leadership Training

The Junior League of Wilmington trains women to be high-impact volunteers and to serve in leadership roles in the non-profit community. We provide our members with an array of formal training and experiential learning opportunities in our efforts to prepare them to serve the community beyond our organization. Some examples of the training through experiences are the opportunity to lead committees, run major fund raisers, present life skills workshops in the community, cultivate fund development activities, and manage, recruit, retain and train volunteers.

In 2017, we held our inaugural Teen Empowerment Summit with young women served by the Choir School of Delaware. Additional Teen Empowerment events are in the works.
