Founded in 2018, Planting to Feed Inc. now operates two urban garden properties, which all produce go directly to feeding the city of Wilmington.

Jessica was born and raised in Philadelphia and surrounding suburbs, after living in Delaware for 10+ years, she considers herself a dedicated Delawarean. She has a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics from Wesley College and a Master's degree in Business Administration from Wilmington University, both in Delaware.

Jessica found her passion for volunteerism and philanthropy while in college and has carried this spirit in her everyday life, and work. In addition to running Planting to Feed Inc. Jessica works for a large global technology company where she manages a team of early career talent.

Jessica prides herself in wearing multiple hats as a philanthropist, community activist, corporate professional, gardener, sorority woman, and wife. She is a member of the Wesley College Alumni Association Board of Directors, sister of Delta Phi Epsilon Sorority, and member of the Junior League of Wilmington. She lives with her husband Lloyd and their dog Logan in the Wilmington suburbs.

Jessica's ultimate goal for Planting to Feed is to provide access to quality foods to her community and empower them with the knowledge to grow on their own. She believes that access to quality foods should not be a privilege, it should be a right.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER Amanda Steinberg



Amanda Steinberg is a personal finance expert with a career that spans finance, digital, and social activism. In 2009, she founded DailyWorth, a startup focused on women's financial prosperity. As CEO of DailyWorth, she published financial advice daily to an audience of over 1 million women. She won multiple awards for DailyWorth including Oprah Winfrey's inaugural Super Soul 100 and Forbes' 21 New American Money Masters. Her journey and experience are documented in her critically acclaimed book "Worth It: Your Life, Your Money, Your Terms". DailyWorth was acquired by HerMoney Media in 2017.

Since 2017, Amanda has focused on digital fundraising for political campaigns and non-profits. In 2019, Steinberg led digital fundraising for Marianne Williamson for President. She's a graduate of Columbia University with a degree in Urban Studies. In her free time, she and her husband, author Jordan Shapiro, are raising 4 teenagers.



KEYNOTE SPEAKER Fayetta Blake



Fayetta M. Blake is the founder and Executive Director of Pathways to Success, Inc. She is also an entrepreneur with several businesses throughout Delaware and Maryland. Fay started her career about 40 years ago in the Lending industry with Security Pacific National Bank where she worked as a loan officer for five years. She then enjoyed a 20-year banking career at All First Financial. Fay held various positions of increasing authority at All First Financial. In 1995, she was appointed as Sr. Vice-President of Operations and was the first African American to be appointed to that level in the bank's 200-year history. During that time, she had global oversight of all Operations units in the Mid-Atlantic region. In 1998, Fay was recognized by this banking institution for Quality Assurance, as well as being recognized in the industry by Visa USA for Quality Service and Outstanding Customer Service.

Pathways to Success, Inc. was established in 2006. The work that Fay does as the Executive Director is indeed her calling and passion. It embodies her need to give back to the community.

In 2014 Fay was recognized as one of Delmarva Broadcasting's "Delmarvelous Women." In 2015 she was recognized for her efforts to aid and assist the underserved communities throughout Sussex County with the Jefferson Award, and in 2018 she was one of Delaware Today's top Women in Business. In 2020, Fay was inducted into the Delaware Women's Hall of Fame and the Indian River Hall of Fame. In 2021, she became an appointed member of the Public/Private Partnership Board of Directors to serve at the pleasure of the Governor. She is a board member for Habitat for Humanity, Lewes Historical Society, a member of the Southern Delaware Alliance for Racial Justice and the DTCC Development Council. She is also a Chairperson of the DANA Public Policy Board as well as a Fund for Women Founder. Recently, she was asked to join the MD/DE/DC ACT council that helps to shape the education and workforce landscape at local and state levels.

She holds a BS degree in Behavioral Science proudly from Wilmington University where she is a member of Phi Gamma Mu, International Honor Society for Social Sciences.

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BREAKOUT SESSION #1

Finding the Balance and Prioritizing Self-Care

Speaker: Suzanne Eder

Women often find themselves giving and giving to others all day long, at work and home, and wonder how they can fit in time for themselves into that full daily schedule. Being maxed out continuously and keeping busy has become society's standard for being successful. As women, this constant drive to do more negatively impacts our ability to find the balance in our lives and prioritize self-care. Studies have shown that women process burnout differently than men. Our busyness results are a lack of time and exhaustion, stress, anxiety, guilt, fear, social comparison, inauthenticity, and physical illness. This session will provide participants with tips to avoid burnout and specific strategies to live with intention, find more time in their day, and determine what they can do.

The Audacious Woman: Dealing with Fears and Building Confidence for the Future

Speaker: Jeannine Cook

Audaciousness could be challenging to define, especially when it has to do with women. However, women tend to limit themselves and their ambitions because they tend to adhere to existing social structures and rigid gender norms. Many women feel the pressure to conform to these standards, resulting in fewer women filling leadership roles than they should be. Using first-hand experiences, the session speaker will highlight how participants can redefine their power and lead themselves with intention. Attendees will leave with practical steps on overcoming their fears, taking risks, successfully taking the plunge, and making a transition personally or professionally.

Building A Personal Brand and Carving a Niche

Speaker: Bett Wiliams

Creating a personal brand can be a daunting, mythical task. And one of the easiest ways to get lost in the process is not knowing where to start. No matter how skilled or experienced one is, if you do not have a commanding presence and can successfully communicate your story, it is more likely for you to remain under-recognized and you will labor to attract recognition. This can be even more challenging for women who have taken a non-linear career path or have taken a pause and now want to re-enter. The competition is fierce, and whether you like it or not, you are part of it. The ability to speak and communicate with confidence and charisma is critical and will eliminate these obstacles allowing you to take your career or business to the next level. In this session, attendees will learn:

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- 1. How to stand out and be taken seriously without alienating others?
- 2. Overcome bias and internal fears that prevent you from stepping up; and
- 3. Assert your presence using solid verbal skills and body language.

BREAKOUT SESSION #2

Influencing People and Building a Network

Speaker: Lynn Evans

Business leaders will generally agree that building a network is key to continued career growth. But, leaders often find that there is more to simply "networking". As the layers get pulled away, a "network" begins to reveal that there are network segments which play a key role in career development. This session will focus on three network pillars: operational, personal, and strategic as identified in HBR's article, "How Leaders Create and Use Networks" <u>(Ibarra and Hunger, 2007)</u>. Attendees will learn:

- 1. Why each segment is key to career development and success.
- 2. How to get out of their comfort zone and push themselves to network in each segment.
- 3. Why strategic networking should be a focal point for any emerging leader.

Building Leadership Skills for Board Membership

Speaker: Stephanie Gorris

Do you have "time, talent, and treasure" to share with a nonprofit organization whose mission resonates with you? Before you commit to joining a board or assuming an officer role, prepare yourself for what is entailed. This session will cover board roles and responsibilities and help you identify what skills you can offer and which you can strengthen. Learn how to find an organization and board that are a fit for you and how to be the high-performing board member or officer every nonprofit executive director seeks.

Leading from Behind the Scenes

Speaker: Carla Stone

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Leading often means acting as the "Wizard of Oz" by anonymously pulling the strings and pressing the buttons to make things fall into place. Many leaders find themselves transitioning into this role after serving as the face or front runner of an organization in management or as an executive director. In this session, attendees will learn:

- 1. Tips for transitioning into a role that requires leadership from behind
- 2. Key components to an effective leadership style
- 3. Adjusting your leadership style for various stakeholders to achieve the overall objective


